#### About our Keynote Speaker – Robert Beltz



Robert Beltz has devoted over two decades to public education. In that time of service, he has served in his roles of classroom teacher, English Language Development (ELD) specialist, consultant, and county ESL leader. He has earned advanced certifications in Trauma Responsiveness, Diversity, Equity & Inclusion, Applied Educational Neuroscience, and English as a Second Language. This unique intersectionality has allowed him to build his craft around relational safety in the schools. Robert is passionate about engaging in the complexities of social emotional learning, advocating for marginalized populations, creating systems of collective care for adults, and collaborating with experts who are

also committed to bringing about radical systemic change.

Currently, Robert is researching the neuro physical changes that may occur in refugee and immigrant students, as well as in other children who are displaced from their environments. At the center of this work is the nature of identity in the developing brain, and the adults' role in validating and affirming this identity for each and every student in their care. As is true for all applied educational neuroscience, this work begins with the adults. Robert engages deeply with local, state, national, and international colleagues in a variety of learning environments.

Robert graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Education from Wayne State University and a Master of Arts in Applied Linguistics from Eastern Michigan University. He has since gone on to earn endorsements and certifications from Starr Commonwealth, Oakland University, Cornell University, and Butler University. He has earned numerous honors and awards for his work.

Bryan has certifications as a Certified Orthopedic Manual Therapist (COMT) in 2008, and in 2019 became a Board-Certified in Sports Physical Therapy from the APTA. Bryan also co-created and co-owned Athletes with Purpose LLC (AWP). A sports performance company in northeast Indiana from 2006-2018. Bryan served as the Chief product officer until 2012, and then the chief education officer until 2018. Athletes training under the AWP program achieved over 200 college scholarships and the program also helped produce 14 professional athletes. Bryan has also been Active in the APTA and in 2019 won the Anthony D. Certo award by the INAPTA to recognize and honor his contribution of time, energy, and expertise toward furthering physical therapy as a professional practice. For 11 years he served as has been the manager of Parkview Athletic Rehab since he created the division in 2013. In 2020 he became the Residency Director and founded 3 ABPTRFE accredited Residency Programs in Sport, Neuro, and Women's Health PT. Bryan Currently Serves on the Indiana APTA practice and payments committee and is a member of the APTA Sports section Specialty Council.

**Sabrina Brown, PhD**, joins the faculty at Manchester University as Assistant Professor of Biology and Environmental Studies. She earned her B.S. and M.S. degrees in Earth & Environmental Sciences from Indiana State University and earned her Ph.D. in Earth & Atmospheric Sciences from University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Julie comes to Manchester with 13 years of clinical experience as an athletic trainer with Parkview Sports Medicine. Most recently, she was at the University of Saint Francis Fort Wayne for the past eight years as the head athletic trainer.

**Dr. Mark Myers** is a distinguished member of the Manchester University faculty, joining the Master's of Athletic Training program in 2023. A native Marylander, Dr. Myers earned a Bachelor of Science in Athletic Training from Salisbury University in 1997, a Master's of Education from The Citadel in 2000, and a Doctorate of Athletic Training from Temple University in 2022. With a rich background in sports medicine, Mark previously served as the Head Athletic Trainer at Mount St. Mary's University, a role held for eight years at the NCAA Division I institution in Central Maryland. Among notable achievements, he was part of the NCAA Division III Washington College men's lacrosse national championship team in 1998 and had the unique experience of being an athletic training student intern with the Indianapolis Colts in 1996 and 1997. Additionally, he contributed to the North East Conference men's basketball championships in 2016 and 2021 and had the opportunity to attend March Madness. Currently residing in Columbia City, Dr. Myers brings a wealth of experience and passion to Manchester University.

She has published several book chapters and numerous articles in peerreviewed journals. She has traveled extensively across Europe, Asia, and North America. She speaks Turkish and Arabic and is eager to serve as a cultural ambassador and translator for students and families from these backgrounds. Dr. Gumus' hobbies include gardening, cooking, hiking, camping, and traveling.
