Bachelor of Science in Sociology: Social Inequality Concentration

Program Overview

Sociology is the study of social life. At the interpersonal level, sociology studies the causes and consequences of such things as identity, romantic love and deviance. At the societal level, it examines and explains such things as poverty, crime and racism. At the global level, it studies such things as immigration, modernization and war. The sociology major and minor are designed to prepare students to enter career fields such as public policy, human services, research analysis and community organizing, among others. The sociology major and minor can also serve as an academic foundation for advanced study in law, justice studies, social work, sociology, criminology, or public policy.

Degree Requirements

To earn this degree, students must have a GPA of 2.0 or higher in the Major as well as an overall GPA of 2.0, complete a minimum of 120 credit hours, and fulfill the course requirements of the program listed below.
